

The fee to file suit is higher and often the court will not even hear the claim. And in cases where the judge thinks it does not warrant the cost of a hearing, he or she will order the case dismissed. As the owner of the debt, you must make the payment within 30 days or you will lose the right to sue in court. Before you file suit, you must also file a timely proof of claim with the court. For example, if you owe \$1,000 in back taxes, you must file a proof of claim with the court and pay the filing fee and the filing cost

within six months of the original date that the taxes were due. If you do not file a timely proof of claim, the court will usually dismiss your claim. If the judge wants the claim to be heard, he or she will order the case to be heard in court. The more serious the charge is, the higher the fee and the more likely that the court will even hear the case. In order to make it even easier to sue someone, most states have a legal claim that does not have to be filed in court. For example, the maximum debt a debtor can be sued for is \$20,000 in the state of North Carolina. In many states, if you have only \$1,000 to \$5,000 in a debt, you can sue in small claims court. In these cases, you do not have to pay the filing fee, and the court will usually allow you to proceed in small claims court. If you owe more than \$5,000, you must file a claim in small claims court, and the court will require that you pay the filing fee and the filing cost to proceed. If the case is only about \$1,000, you may still file in small claims court, but the court may still order the case to be heard in court if the debtor owes more than \$1,000.
